



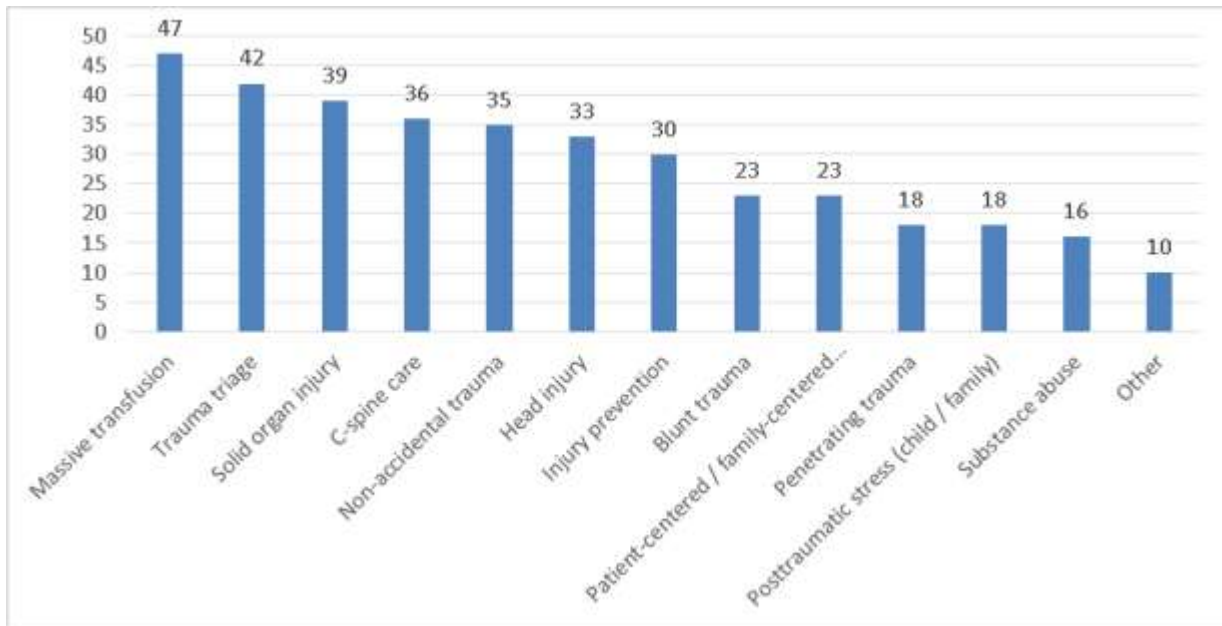

- We are currently developing protocols. Currently we do not have educational resources to share but would be willing to do so in the future.

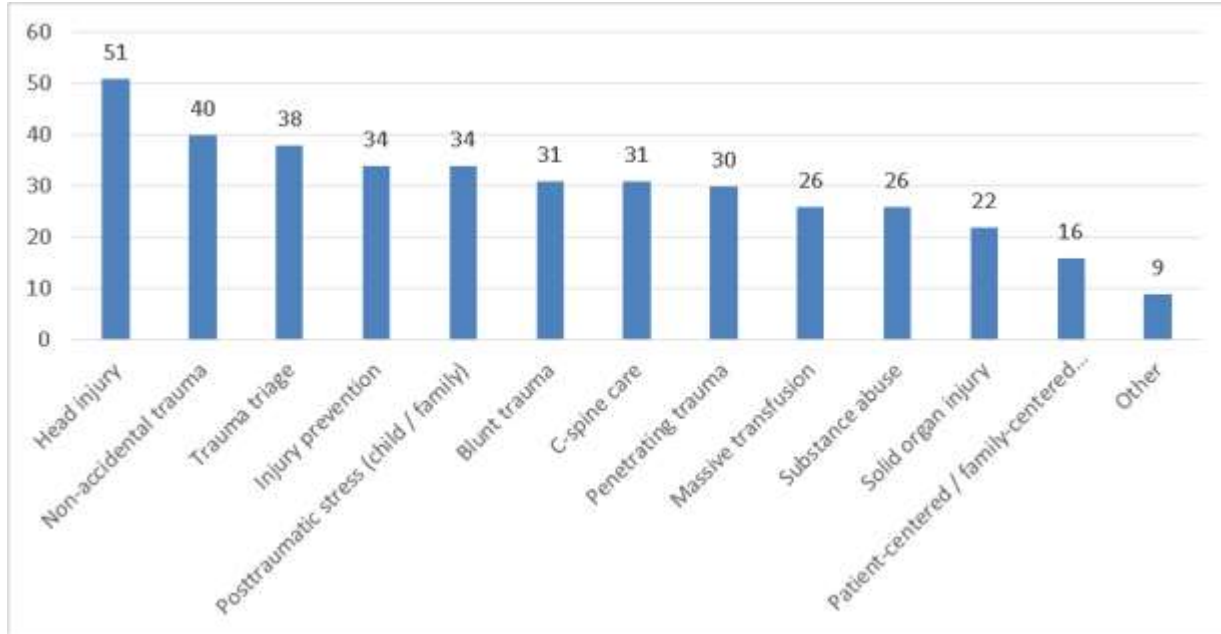
- We are currently working on the ergonomics of our trauma bays to increase our efficiency and quality

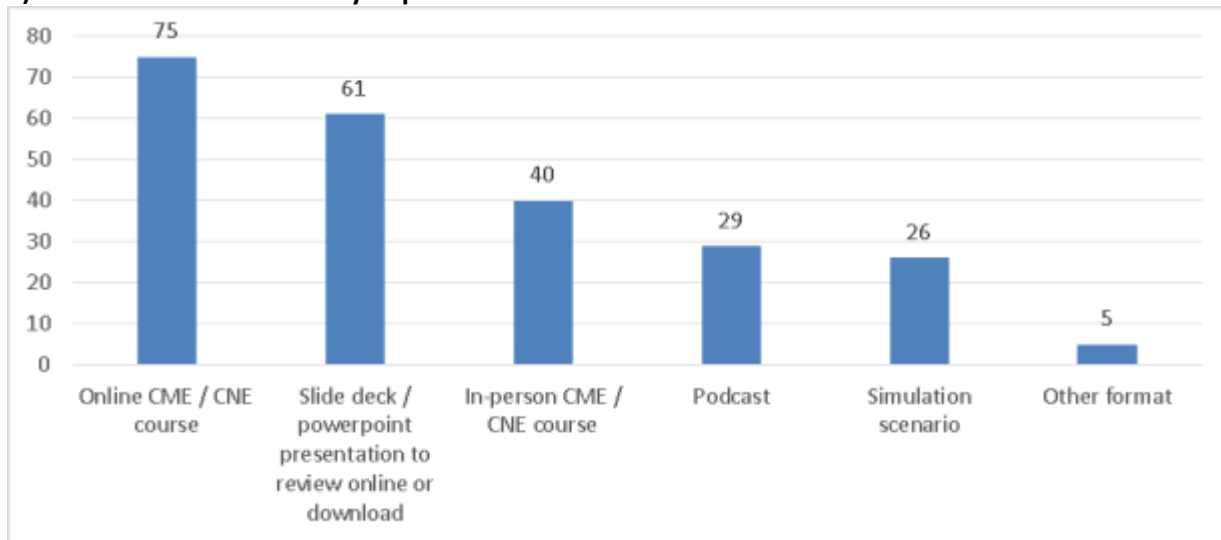

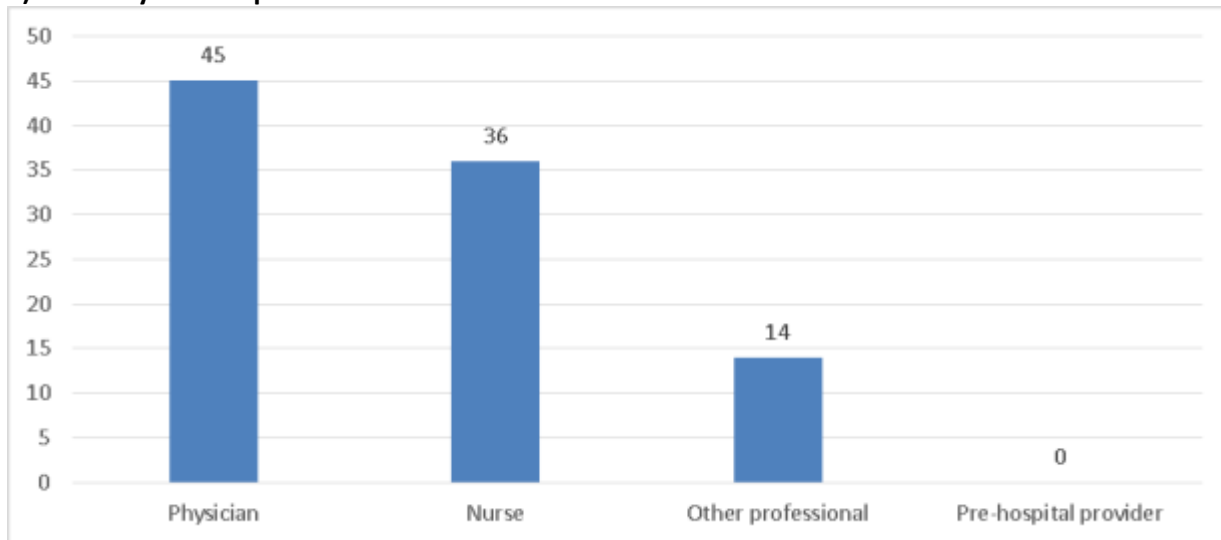

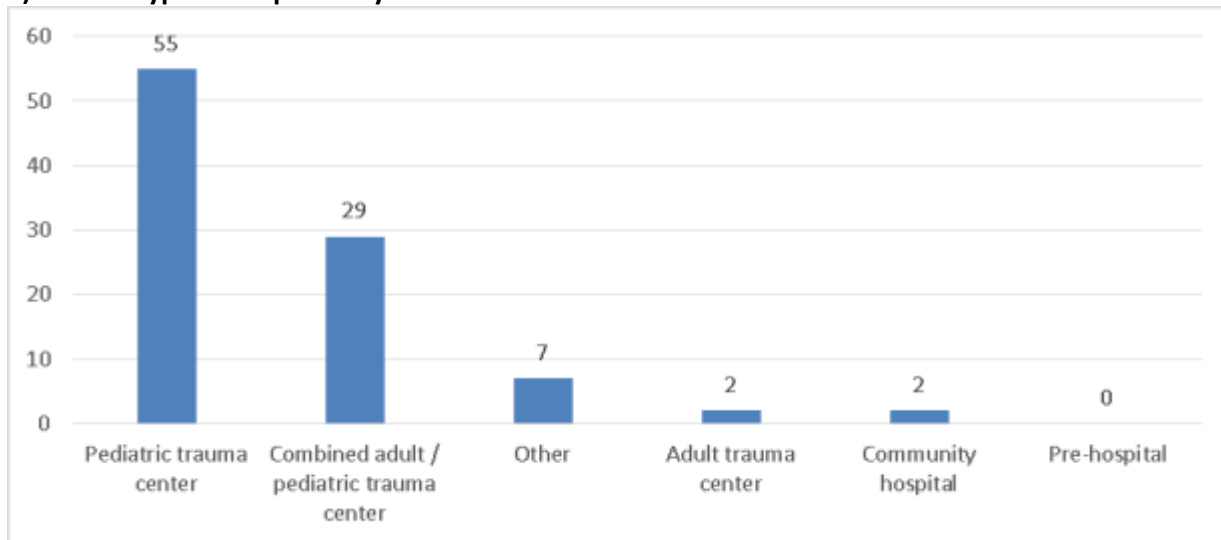
